Production Wraps On Local Feature Film

Fort Collins will soon be making an appearance on the silver screen. A group of local filmmakers, collaborating under the name of Exploding Goldfish Films, will complete principal photography on the feature film tentatively titled *Untitled Search for God* tomorrow. The feature, which stars recent Poudre High School graduate Sean Cummings as John Porter, a man in love with Fran Ferris (Rocky Mountain High School student Rosalie Robinson), a woman who is probably a serial killer—although she claims her victims are all vampires—was shot almost entirely in Fort Collins and on the Front Range. Also featured are Poudre High School teacher Richard Ney, who plays Antony, a mob boss who has been double-crossed by Richy (Andy Mitchell), a crooked accountant, and Vvinni Gagnepain as a man in a dog suit who thinks he's God.

The film is directed by Andrew Gingerich, a Poudre High School graduate and current film major at the Minneapolis College of Art and Design. The script was written by Poudre High School graduate Ethan Holbrook, who is also the producer. Principal photography for the movie has been unusually short—only three weeks, meaning that work on the project has been fast and intense.

The last day of shooting on the production is tomorrow, Friday the thirteenth. Shooting will take place at Rocky Mountain Shooters Supply, 3507 E. Mulberry, from 5:30 to 8:30 P.M. After that, a long period of editing and post-production will follow. *Untitled Search for God* is aiming for a summer 2008 release, with a projected runtime of two hours.
